History is an exciting subject within the humanities faculty at SRG. A deep understanding of history allows us to understand how our world is shaped today. History is essential for understanding concepts such as cause and consequence, similarity and difference and change and continuity. We may learn lessons from history that may inform future actions.

In addition to the fascinating knowledge that we may learn in the subject many life skills are developed whilst studying history. Skills of communication, analysis, enquiry and interpretation are important for students whatever they choose to do in later life.

## KS3

Pupils will learn the skills of history throughout the key stage. In Year 7 pupils will study Medieval history looking at the impact of the Norman Conquest on England and Wales. Year 8 will focus on change and conflict in Wales and Britain between 1500-1760. In Year 9 pupils will study changes in Wales, Britain and the wider world from 1760 to the twentieth century.
